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HISTORY: INCEPTION TO FUNCTION

Establishment of six new All India Institute of Medical Sciences, AIIMS Patna being one of them, was a dream project of our beloved Prime Minister Shri Atal Bihari Vajpayee. He made a public announcement to this effect during his independence day address from the Red Fort, New Delhi on August 15, 2003. They were to be developed under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) with the objective of correcting regional imbalances in the availability of affordable and reliable tertiary healthcare services and augmenting the facilities for quality medical education in the country. The foundation stone of All India Institute of Medical Sciences Patna (then officially Jay Prakash Narayan, All India Institute of Medical Sciences Patna) was laid down on 2nd January 2004 at Phulwari Sharif, Patna by Shri Bhairon Singh Shekhawat, the then Vice President of India in presence of Justice Jesus, the then a Judge in supreme court of India, Smt. Rabri Devi, the then Chief Minister of Bihar and Smt. Sushma Swaraj, the then Health Minister of India.

The estimated cost of the project was Rs 355 crore in 2004. It was allotted 101.98 acres of land, comprising the main campus of 66.98 acres and residential complex of 35 acres located at Bhusaula village of Phulwarisharif and Khagaul respectively. In 2006 the union cabinet announced the setting up of six new AIIMS like Institution. Its cost was escalated from Rs. 335 crore to Rs. 823 crore. In August 2010 the central cabinet gave its nod for setting up of societies to run six AIIMS like Institutions at a cost of 823 crores. The societies were legal entities that ensured greater autonomy and faster execution of the projects. The work on six institutes including AIIMS Patna started in earnest in 2009.

Notification for the appointment of Prof. Dr Girish Kumar Singh, the founder director, was done on 30th August 2011 (ref. No A-11013/1/2008-9-SSH, Gol, MoHFW, New Delhi) and he subsequently joined the institute on 1st November 2011. He was also given the charge of the Nodal Director for

appointing faculties of all six new AIIMS of the country to start their teaching and other services. AIIMS Patna came into real existence as an Institute of National Importance (INI) by an Act of Parliament under the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (Amendment) Bill, 2012. The Act enabled AIIMS Patna to be an autonomous body on the lines of the existing AIIMS New Delhi. The Official inauguration ceremony for the institute was held on 25th September 2012 and MBBS classes with a batch strength of 50 students were started on that date. AIIMS New Delhi was announced as the mentoring Institute for AIIMS Patna. AIIMS Patna doubled the intake of students to its MBBS course from 50 to 100 in 2013.

The first surgery was performed on 26th Dec 2013. Health cards were launched in May 2015. In July 2015, AIIMS Patna started free surgery for leprosy patients. On 6th March 2016, AIIMS Patna made history by training 3200 people in first-aid care at Siwan's Rajendra Stadium. This was later recognised and recorded in Guinness book of world records. From January 2016 onwards, the Institute has started offering some state of the art services like joint replacement, arthroscopy, cochlear implants, interventional radiology, pediatric urology, laparoscopic surgery, hepatobiliary surgery etc. All of this could be made possible only with the starting of multiple important clinical areas including pediatric and neonatal ICU, physical and rehabilitation centre, modular operation theaters, postoperative ward, high dependency unit, advanced radiology setup including digital X ray, high end digital mammography, 4D colour Doppler, 256 slice CT scan and Biplane DSA.

On 31st October 2016 Prof. Dr Gitanjali Batmanabane, Director AIIMS Bhubaneswar was given the additional and interim charge of Director AIIMS Patna as Dr Girish Kumar Singh had successfully completed his tenure as the founder director of the institute. Dr Prabhat Kumar Singh from SGPGI, Lucknow joined the Institute as its regular Director on 27.02.2017.

FROM THE DIRECTOR: AN OVERVIEW



When I received the baton from Prof. Dr Gitanjali Batmanabane at the end of February 2017, I well comprehended the huge responsibility bestowed upon me to take forward and develop my juvenile Institute as a field leader in medical teaching, training, research and clinical services. It was an opportunity for me to prune and shape the developing institute through synergistic vision and realise the very mandate of its creation to **"provide the most modern healthcare to the last man in the queue at affordable cost"**.

Although year 2016-17 witnessed significant administrative transition of directors, deputy director and medical superintendent, the institute faculty with a mere strength of 56 were able to best perform services within available resources. The figures like more than three lakh foot falls in the OPD, forty-six hundred admissions and thirty-six hundred surgeries in 2016-17 speak about the zeal and commitment to service of the AIIMS Patna team. The responsibility to further develop the resources and services in keeping with the growing needs and standards was my immediate challenge.

Towards resource creation: Estate and engineering work which had slowed down was put back to pace; the stalled faculty recruitment was reinitiated and process for further recruitment of group A,B,C staff was started. In academics e-learning was strengthened by linking with National Medical Library's electronic resources in Medicine (ERMED) consortium. Towards medical technology development, Memorandum of understanding (MoU) with NIT Durgapur and Incubation Centre of IIT Patna were formalised for collaboration in

medical technology development.

For service expansion: The Institute had already started offering some state of the art services like joint replacement, arthroscopy, cochlear implants, maxillofacial distraction osteogenesis, computer assisted design and 3D printing for reconstructive surgery, interventional radiology, paediatric urology, laparoscopic surgery, etc. All this could be made possible only with the starting of multiple important clinical areas including paediatric and neonatal ICU, physical & rehabilitation centre, modular OTs, postoperative ward, high dependency unit, advanced radiology setup including digital X ray, high end digital mammography, 4D colour Doppler, 256 slice CT scan, 3 T MRI and Biplane DSA.

In community outreach and training AIIMS Patna continued with its regional leadership and capacity building process by imparting Training of Trainers (TOT) and delegating Quick Medical Response Team (QMRT) training to the Government of Bihar. AIIMS Patna registered its name in the Guinness Book of World Records by training 3200 people in first aid care at a small district town Siwan.

Administrative challenges are integral part of growth and development of emerging Institute and Year 2016-17 witnessed a few. Creating resources and expanding services to meet regional health needs based on prevailing socio-economic and cultural conditions of the state and reducing existing disparity in the health care system to bring it at par with global standards would be my forth coming challenge in the year 2017-18.

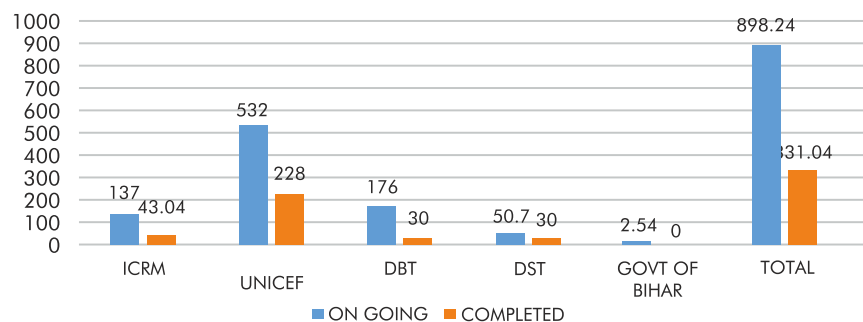

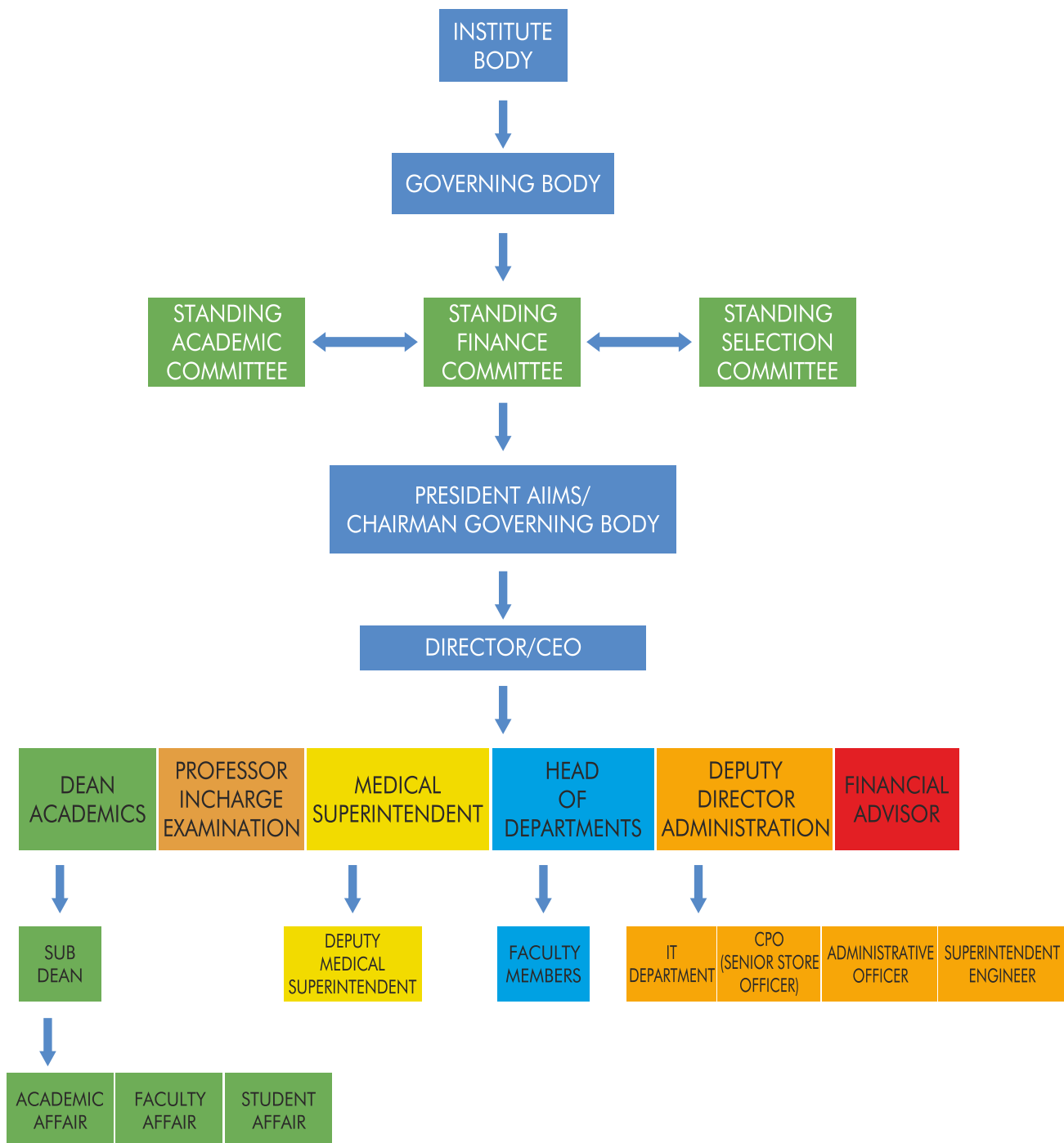

5.5 VIGILANCE CELL

The office of Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO) was created on 4th March 2016 vide order No.847/AllMS/Pat/Dir./ 2016 to check the activities leading to corruption. The role and functions of CVO is broadly divided in to two components.

1. The preventive side:

- (a) To examine in detail the existing Rules and procedures of the Organisation with a view to eliminate or minimise the scope for corruption or malpractices.
- (b) To identify the sensitive/corruption prone spots in the Organisation and keep an eye on personnel posted in such areas.
- (c) To plan and enforce surprise inspections and regular inspections to detect the system failures and existence of corruption or malpractices.
- (d) To maintain proper surveillance on officers of doubtful integrity.
- (e) To ensure prompt observance of Conduct Rules relating to integrity of the Officers, like
 - (i) The Annual Property Returns.
 - (ii) Gifts accepted by the officials.
 - (iii) Benami transactions.
 - (iv) Regarding relatives employed in private firms or doing private business etc.

2. The punitive side:

- (i) To ensure speedy processing of vigilance cases at all stages. In regard to cases requiring consultation with the Central Vigilance Commission, a decision as to whether the case had a vigilance angle shall in every case be taken by the CVO who, when in doubt, may refer the matter to his administrative head, i.e. Secretary in the case of Ministries/ Departments and Chief Executive in the

case of public sector organisations.

- (ii) To ensure that charge-sheet, statement of imputations, lists of witness and documents etc. are carefully prepared and copies of all the documents relied upon and the statements of witnesses cited on behalf of the disciplinary authority are supplied wherever possible to the accused officer along with the charge-sheet.
- (iii) To ensure that all documents required to be forwarded to the enquiring Officer are carefully sorted out and sent promptly.
- (iv) To ensure that there is no delay in the appointment of the enquiring Officer, and that no dilatory tactics are adopted by the accused officer or the Presenting Officer.
- (v) To ensure that the processing of the enquiry Officer's Reports for final orders of the Disciplinary Authority is done properly and quickly.
- (vi) To scrutinise final orders passed by the Disciplinary Authorities subordinate to the Ministry/Department, with a view to see whether a case for review is made out or not.
- (vii) To see that proper assistance is given to the C.B.I. in the investigation of cases entrusted to them or started by them on their own source of information.
- (viii) To take proper and adequate action with regard to writ petitions filed by accused officers.
- (ix) To ensure that the Central Vigilance Commission is consulted at all stages where it is to be consulted and that as far as possible, the time limits prescribed in the Vigilance Manual for various stages are adhered to.
- (x) To ensure prompt submission of returns

to the Commission.

- (xi) To review from time to time the existing arrangements for vigilance work in the Ministry/Department for vigilance work subordinate officers to see if they are adequate to ensure expeditious and effective disposal of vigilance work.
- (xii) To ensure that the competent disciplinary authorities do not adopt a dilatory or law attitude in processing vigilance cases, thus knowingly otherwise helping the subject public servants, particularly in cases of officers due to retire.
- (xiii) To ensure that cases against the public servants on the verge of retirement do not lapse due to time-limit for reasons such as misplacement of files etc. and that the orders passed in the cases of retiring officers are implemented in time.
- (xiv) To ensure that the period from the date of serving a charge-sheet in a disciplinary case to the submission of the report of the Inquiry Officer, should, ordinarily, not exceed six months.

6.1 Services of AIIMS Hospital

Outpatients Services:

Outpatient services are provided by Internal medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Paediatrics, Orthopaedics, Otorhinolaryngology, Ophthalmology, Dermatology, PMR & Ayush, Paediatric Surgery, Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgery, Plastic surgery, Neurology, Neurosurgery, Radiotherapy, Pulmonaery Medicine, Radio Diagnosis, Dentistry, Psychiatry, Tele Medicine, Pain clinic, Pre anaesthesia check-up clinic. Many speciality clinics are run by different departments on regular basis.

Inpatient Services:

General medicine, General Surgery, Obstetrics & Gynaecology, Paediatrics, Orthopaedics,

Otorhinolaryngology, Ophthalmology, Paediatric Surgery, Cardiothoracic & Vascular Surgery, Plastic surgery, Dentistry, Neurology, Neurosurgery has inpatient beds.

Chemotherapy facility is available in Day Care ward. Anaesthesiology department provides anaesthesia services, acute and chronic pain services and acute care in emergency situation for inpatient. Critical Care in adult and paediatric patient is provided with ventilator support. Birth services are provided to booked obstetrics cases.

Diagnostic Services:

The lab is situated in the basement of Ayush & PMR block. It provides its services on payment basis on concessional rates. It provides

pathology, microbiology, and biochemistry related investigations for both outpatient and inpatient with support from faculties and residents of AIIMS Patna. Histopathology, cytopathology and some of the other services are coordinated with respective departments of the Medical College. ECG and Echocardiography services are also available. NCS, EMG and EEG services are provided as neurological investigations.

Radiological services are provided by Department of Radiology. Radiology services are provided to both outpatients and inpatients. It has facilities for X-ray, Ultrasound, Mammography, CT scan, and Digital Subtraction Angiography and MRI.

Physical Medicine Rehabilitation & Ayush:

Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation department is attached with fully functional Physiotherapy department. Homeopathy services are also available and functional under OPD.

Telemedicine Services:

AIIMS Patna has telemedicine services through which it is providing services to the village community of remote areas.

Vaccination Services:

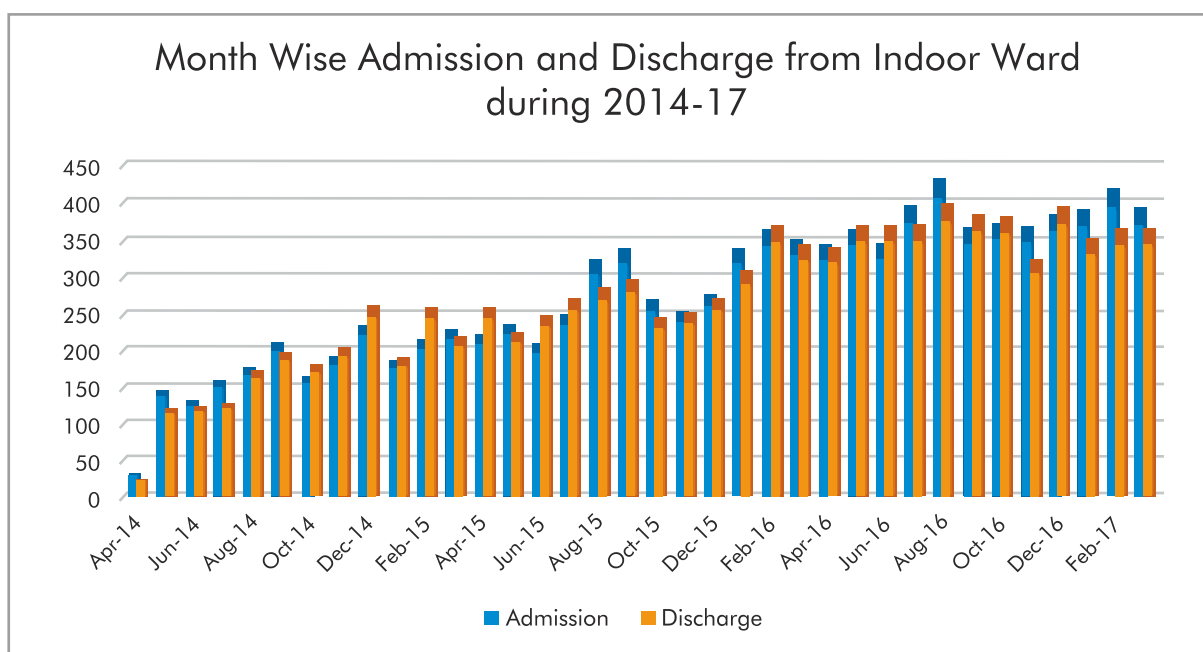
Vaccination services are available for paediatrics and adult patients. AIIMS Patna is the only centre for yellow fever vaccination in Bihar.

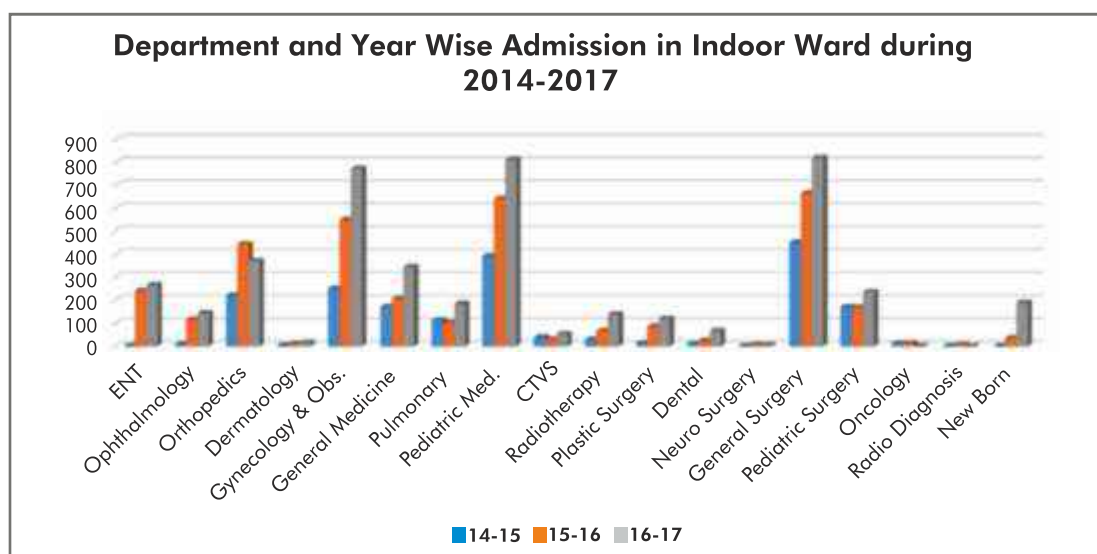
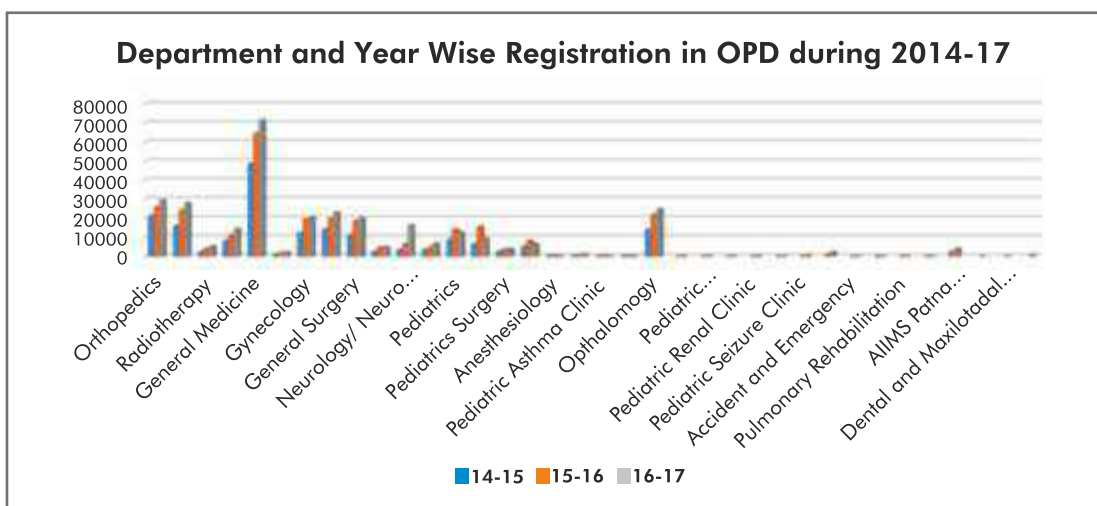
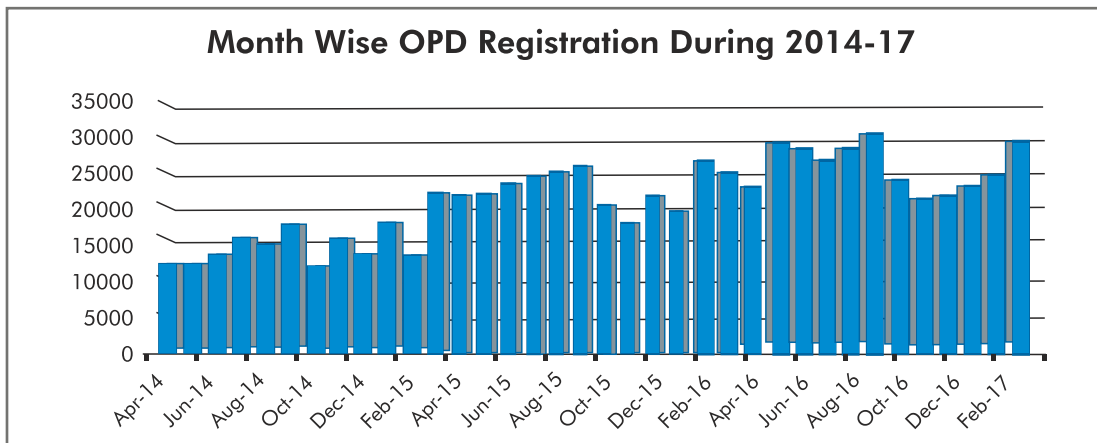

Laundry services:

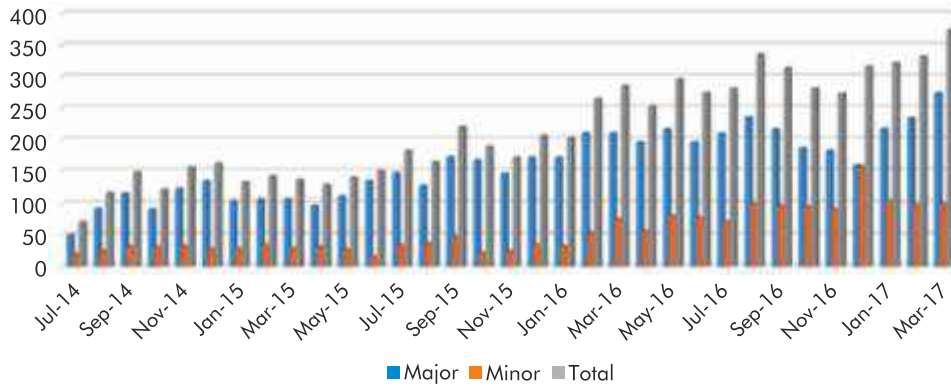

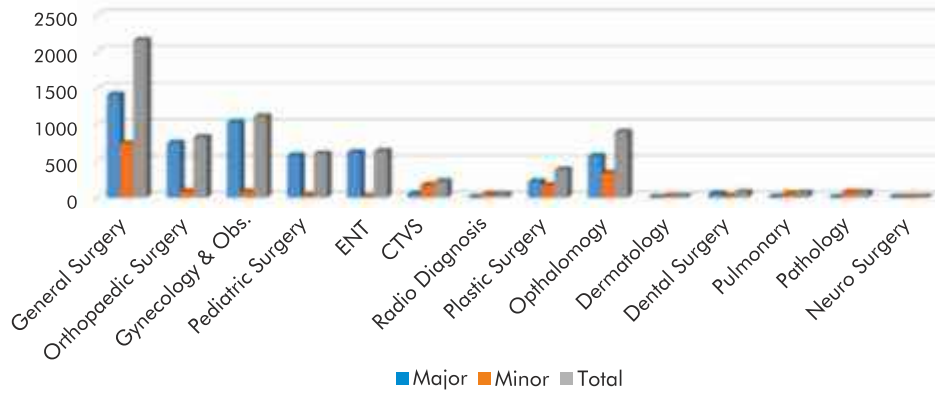




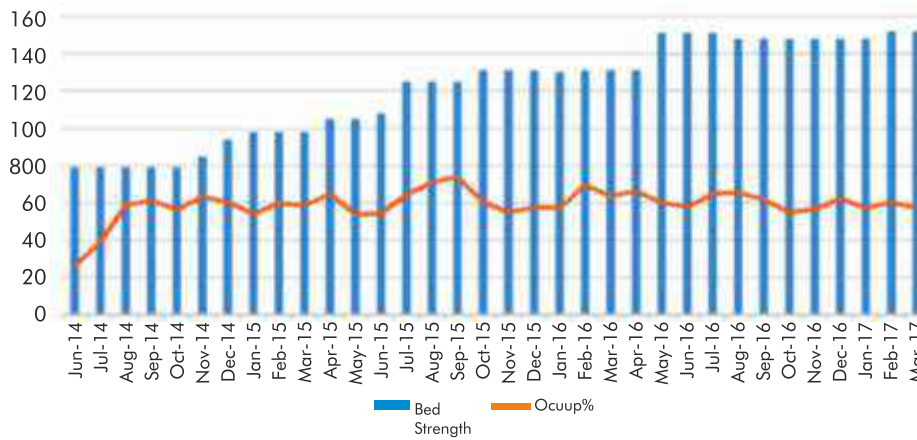
Major and Minor Surgeries Performed During the period July 2014 to March 2017

6.3 TELEMEDICINE AND COMMUNITY OUTREACH SERVICES

Telemedicine Department of AIIMS Patna has been working since the beginning of clinical services in the Institute in December 2012 under the Community Outreach Services. The aim of this service is to provide the healthcare facility to the last man in the queue. Initially the department had opened sixty Telemedicine Centers in various districts of Bihar such as Siwan, Chapra, Buxar, and Sitamarhi etc. but due to lack of manpower and financial support only 22 centers are now connected to our institute.

Clinical Services:

1. This department provides free medical consultation to the person at their home (between 9:00 AM to 5:00 PM) with the help of Skype and Evolko.
2. Twenty two (22) TMO (Telemedicine operator) from various areas of Bihar are connected with the Telemedicine Unit of AIIMS Patna.
3. We have treated more than 1, 00,000 People of the Community by this facility and in last year we have treated total of 7000 patients.
4. Department has conducted 9 health camps at various part of Bihar in the last one year.
5. The team of this department has also visited flood affected area of Bihar to provide medical care.

Educational Activities:

1. Runs the Sharvan Kumar Yojana to give training on how to give care to elderly.
2. Runs one day courses to train the common people and school going children about pre-hospital care for trauma victims.
3. Trained 90 candidates under the Sharvan Kumar Yojana and 165 common people on how to become first responders to manage trauma victims at the accident site.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS DIVISION: FROM THE DEAN

The Academic Section develops policy, plans and executes academic activities. These activities encompass the undergraduate medical and nursing courses. These activities are conducted by the undergraduate and postgraduate cells.

7.1 TEACHING PROGRAMME:

UNDERGRADUATE EDUCATION

The section handles post-admission formalities for new students, develops and revises curricula and administers teaching programmes including internal assessment of undergraduate students admitted to various courses. The courses include MBBS, BSc (Hons). Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS)

The pattern of education in MBBS course was reviewed and re-structured from July 2014 onwards. The MBBS course is of 5½ years duration and comprises of 3 phases and internship. The details are as follows:

In the MBBS course, at present, every year 100 Indian students are admitted. The list of categorized MBBS students for the session 2016-2017 is as follows (Total Admitted 100, UR-28, OBC- 49, SC-17, and ST- 06). These selections were made based on an All-India Entrance Examination. For Orthopaedic physically handicapped (OPH) candidates 3% reservation was provided on horizontal basis. This year, six meritorious MBBS students were awarded scholarships for securing first and second positions in the first, second and final professional examinations.

NURSING EDUCATION

Nursing education is provided through college of Nursing which has its own building. The college of nursing maintains a departmental library with 608 books. Further procurement of books for the departmental library and for the establishment of Nursing Library at allocated floor space is in progress.

POSTGRADUATE EDUCATION

The Academic Section is looking after different activities pertaining to the start of post-graduation MSc/M.D/ M.Ch courses in different disciplines. Inspection and assessment of several departments have already been done by teams from AIIMS Delhi. The post graduate courses are yet to start.

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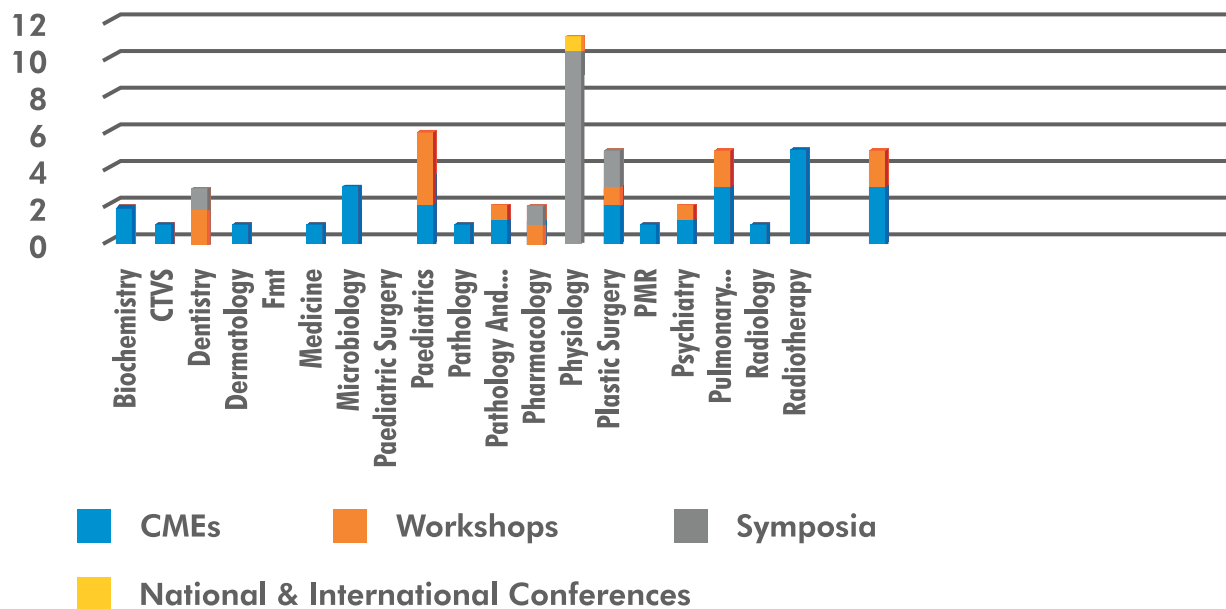

9.2 HOSTEL SECTION

- Other sport materials like hammer, high jump stand, discus etc.

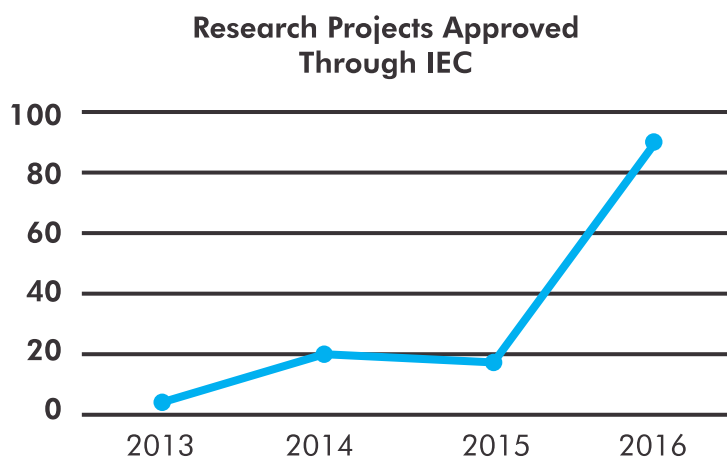

10.5 DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AND FAMILY MEDICINE

The department deals with populations, and comprises those doctors who try to measure the needs of the population, both sick and well, who plan and administer services to meet those needs. The department offers educational and research opportunities for individuals pursuing careers in patient-care, public health, advancing knowledge through epidemiological, biostatistical, behavioral and socio-clinical, ethical, legal and research spheres.

The centre is consistently working towards discovery of new knowledge in domain of public health, advocacy for application of new ideas in health care of populations. The department is actively involved in providing its expertise both at the national as well as at the state health programs and policy through active participation.

The students are exposed to various research methodology techniques through participatory learning techniques. They are being trained for the use of statistical software SPSS version 10 for

data analysis.

The department is designated as AEFI (Adverse Effect Following Immunization) technical collaborating centre with RI Cell, State Health Society Bihar on 28th July 2016. The causality assessment of all deaths or hospitalization of under five children following routine immunisation are done with expert committee members and reports are sent to state for further action.

A vaccination center for Yellow fever and oral polio vaccine has been started from 21st August 2016 in Department of Community and Family Medicine under the aegis of Ministry of Health and Family welfare, Government of India. The only authorised and approved centre for yellow fever vaccination in Bihar and Jharkhand. A Tobacco cessation clinic has been started in OPD of main hospital of AIIMS, Patna in collaboration with Department of Pulmonary medicine and Department of Radiotherapy from 22nd February 2017.

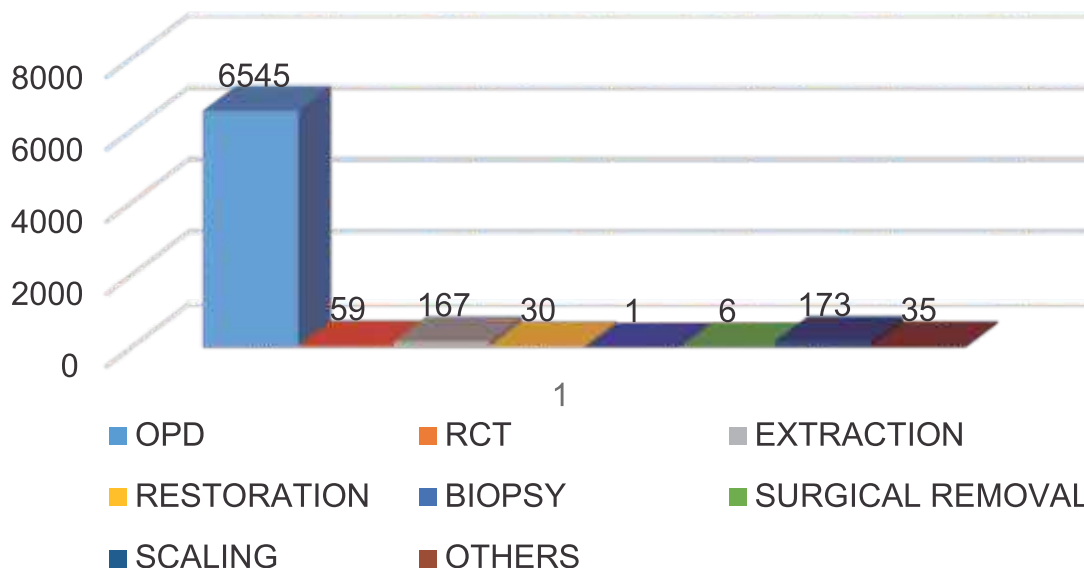
The department harbours special sense of

Various special clinics pertaining to specific diseases are being run through the department on specific days of the week.

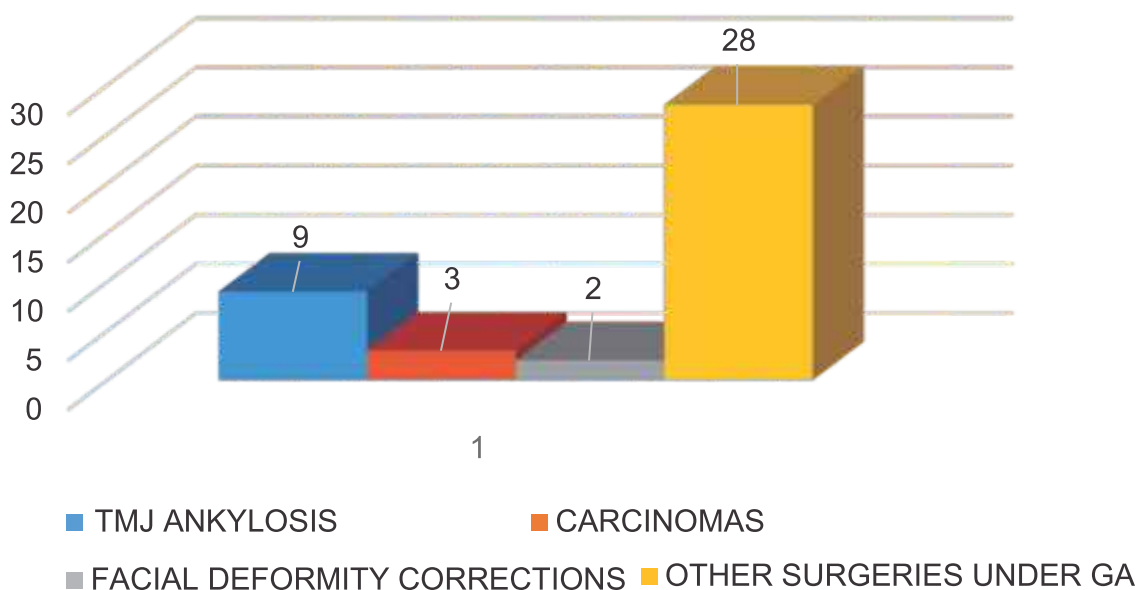

10.7 DEPARTMENT OF DERMATOLOGY, STD & LEPROSY

Department of Dermatology, STD & Leprosy at AIIMS, Patna aims to provide excellent tertiary care services for management of dermatological diseases, sexually transmitted diseases and leprosy with special emphasis on making available sophisticated and affordable healthcare to all patients. The department is giving service through OPD and IPD. Dermatology OPD is being visited by over 100 patients daily.

Skin biopsy, chemical peeling, electrocautery, woods lamp examination, vitiligo surgery like punch grafting, nail surgery, acne scar revision are being done on regular basis. Leprosy clinic runs weekly on every Wednesday. Free MDT is provided to Leprosy patients on a monthly basis. Psoriasis Clinic runs on every Friday.

The department plans to run General OPD daily and special clinics like pigmentary disorders, paediatric dermatology and STD clinics. Separate minor OT will be established to treat patients needing interventions like chemical

peeling, radiofrequency removal of skin lesions etc. Laser clinic and PUVA chamber room will be established. Departmental Seminar Room will be established for conducting regular seminars in the department.

Department plans to develop state of art dermatology services with following facilities:

1. Facility for lasers
2. Facility for intense pulse light (IPL)
3. ICTC centre
4. STD clinic with facilities for counselling and availability of free drugs
5. Dedicated Cosmetic clinic for addressing the cosmetic problems.
6. Facility for Dermatotomy like Dermabrasion laser surgery etc
7. Inpatient care for admitting patients of severe skin diseases.
8. Postgraduate course in Dermatology, STD and Leprosy.

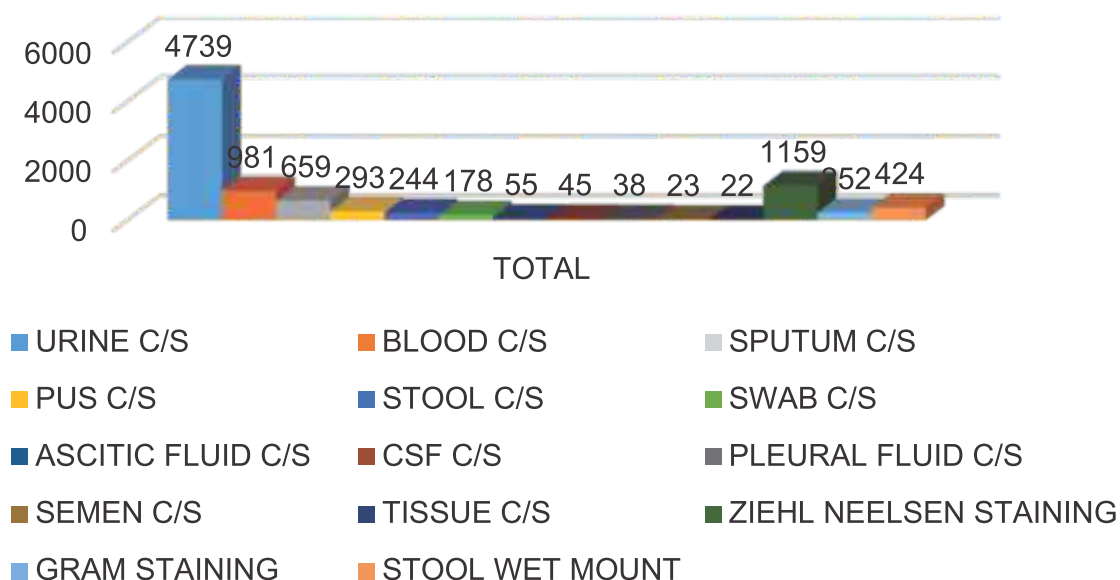

10.13 DEPARTMENT OF NEUROLOGY

The Department in short course of time has become one of the busiest with the OPD catering to more than 8000 old and new patients from August 2016 to March 2017. Regular academic activities are being undertaken for MBBS and nursing students.

10.14 DEPARTMENT OF OBSTETRICS AND GYNAECOLOGY

The Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology is well established department providing patient care services through OPD, IPD, surgeries and labour room. Special clinics for Reproductive Endocrinology, Infertility and Antenatal clinics for High Risk cases have been started. Teaching of MBBS and Nursing students are carried with methods designed to address female patients. There is facility for labour room and ultra sound. Between April 2016 and March 2017, we have seen 21250 patients in the OPD. Most of our Obstetric cases are of High Risk Pregnancy. We are doing all major and minor surgeries, including Hysterectomies, Radical surgery for malignancies, Laparotomy. Laparoscopic surgery is also undertaken. 460 surgeries were done in Operation Room. Minor procedures are carried out on outpatient basis and 105 procedures were carried out as OPD procedures. Trans abdominal, Transvaginal as well as Doppler velocimetry is done. 3D scan facility is also available. Foetal Biophysical profile monitoring with Real Time Ultrasound and Cardiotocograph is also being done. This facility is new to High Risk Antenatal women in the city. Between April 2016 and March 2017, 4531 scans on Gynaecological and Obstetrics cases were performed. Expertise for invasive Foetal Medicine techniques is available; Genetic Laboratory facilities are awaited.

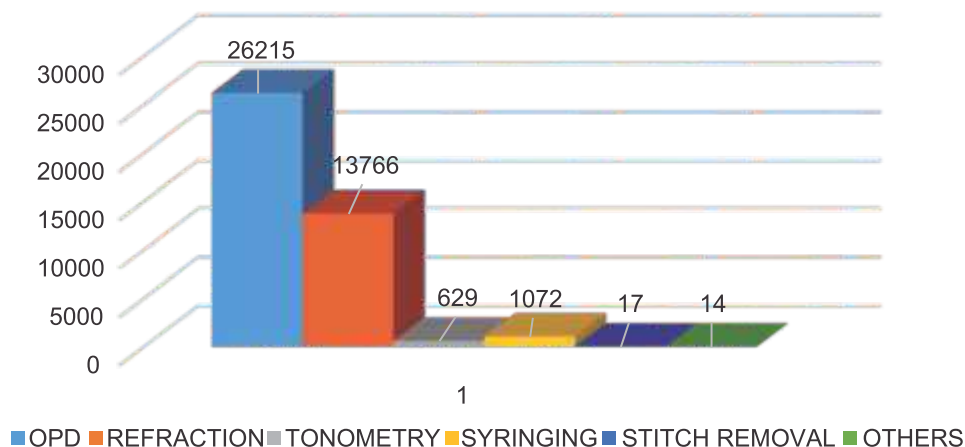

10.15 DEPARTMENT OF OPHTHALMOLOGY

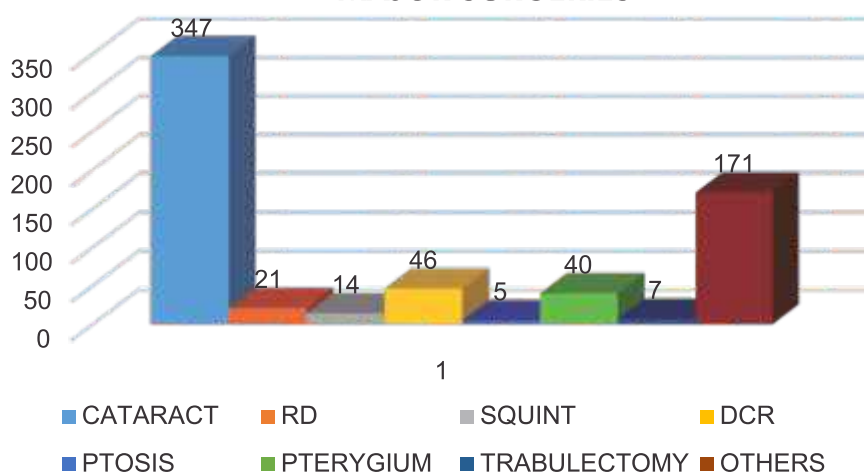

10.16 DEPARTMENT OF ORTHOPAEDICS

Orthopaedics is one of the busiest departments of the hospital. On an average the OPD turnout is 140-150 patients and we have seen 29651 patients from 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017. We run speciality clinics for Arthritis, Spine, Sports Injury and Paediatrics Orthopaedics. In last one year we have operated on 385 cases out of which most of them are tertiary level centre cases. Department of Orthopaedics is doing Joint replacement and

arthroscopic ACL reconstruction regularly and has surpassed the number done at any Medical College in Bihar.

The department ongoing endeavour is to become a Center of Excellence in Tertiary Care by Jan 2019 in the Eastern Region. It plans to establish Orthopaedics Speciality Units like – Paediatric Orthopaedics Surgery, Spine, Sports Injury, Arthroplasty, Hand & micro surgery.

10.17 DEPARTMENT OF OTORHINOLARYNGOLOGY

The Department of Otorhinolaryngology is now an established tertiary care centre for ear, nose, and throat related diseases in this part of the country. The department is excelling in clinical field with high standards of surgical work being done routinely in the department. Other than routine surgeries the department excels in performing complicated surgeries ranging from cochlear implants, endoscopic skull base surgeries, and extensive head and neck cancer surgeries with reconstruction (micro vascular free flap reconstructions). Department work both in the clinical and academic sector is being recognised at national and international levels. The department has also received many awards and honours in the last academic year.

The department is one of the most well equipped departments when it comes to surgical

equipment and instruments. We have recently got ENT navigation system which has added to our list of world class surgical equipment.

The department is now an established centre for cochlear implants and all other high level nasal, skull base and head and neck surgeries. We get referral patients from not only Bihar but from adjoining areas of Uttar Pradesh, Jharkhand, Nepal etc. People of Bihar and nearby places are being catered to in a wholesome way.

The department caters to different specialised procedures and investigative services such as radiofrequency ablation, cochlear implants, endoscopic skull base surgeries, head and neck cancers with free flap reconstructions and investigations like pure tone audiogram, impedance audiogram, OAE and BERA services.

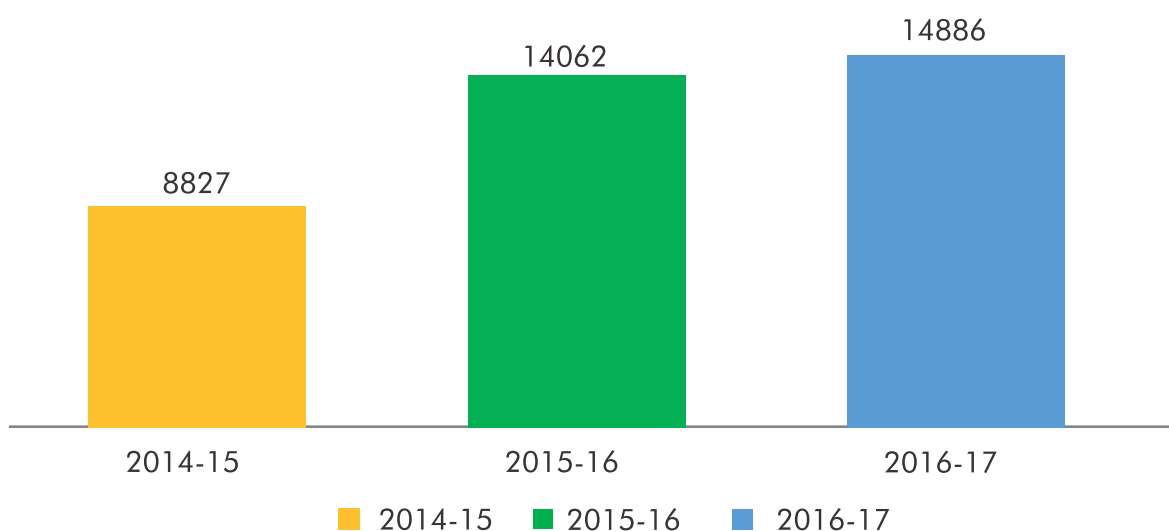
fulfilling the Institute's mandate of providing this hitherto deficient region with specialised tertiary pediatric care. Some of the highlights for the year 2016-17 include:

- Consolidation of existing pediatric sub-speciality clinics including dedicated filing & record keeping for all registered patients

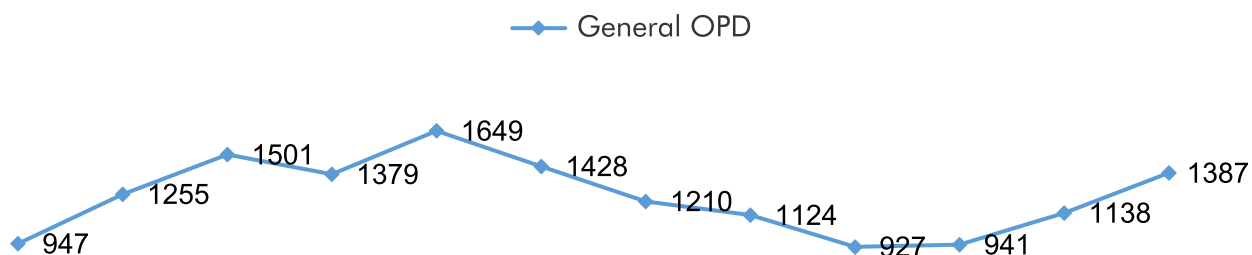

(cumulative frequency)



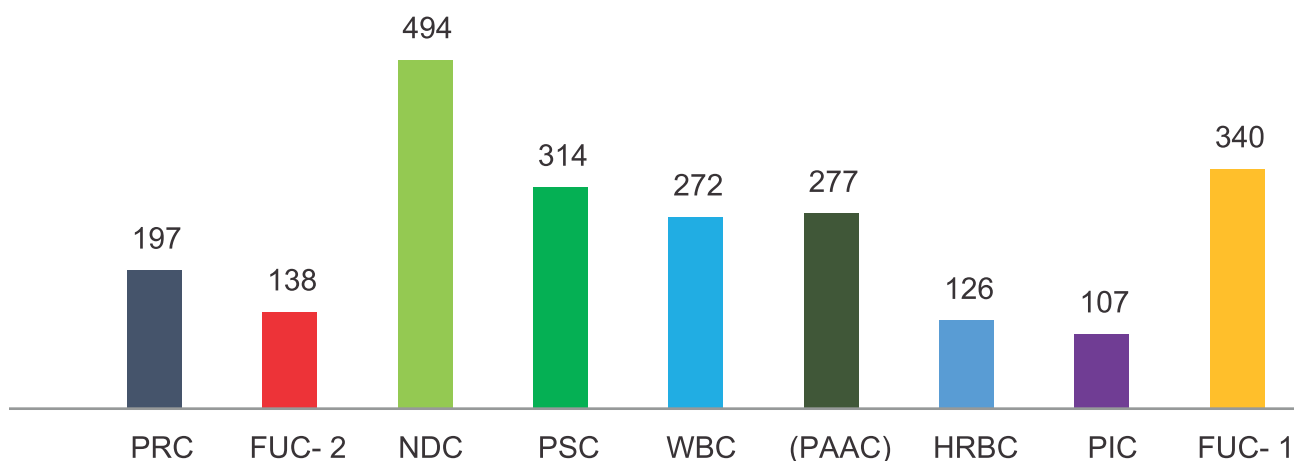

Patients attending General Pediatric OPD (cumulative frequency)

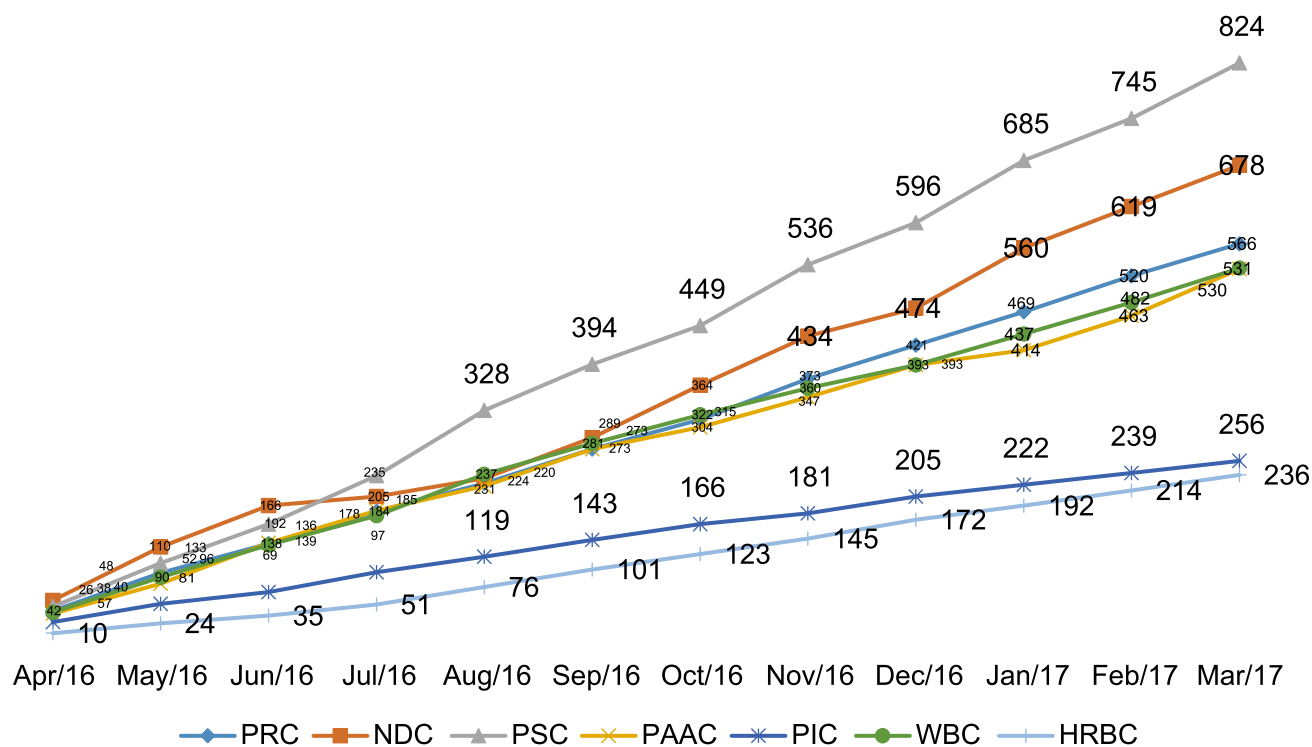

Indoor Services: The volume of admissions increased from 393 in 2014-15, 513 in 2015-16 to 1081 in 2016-17. In order to provide more comprehensive services and to cater to increasing admissions, the pediatric indoor services were functionally divided into two units with Unit 1 providing pediatric neurology services and Unit 2 catering pediatric nephrology & allergy- immunology services in addition to general pediatric services. This dichotomy of services was devised to ensure more robust follow-up along with the ambitious vision of acting as formative nuclei to future subspecialty indoor units.

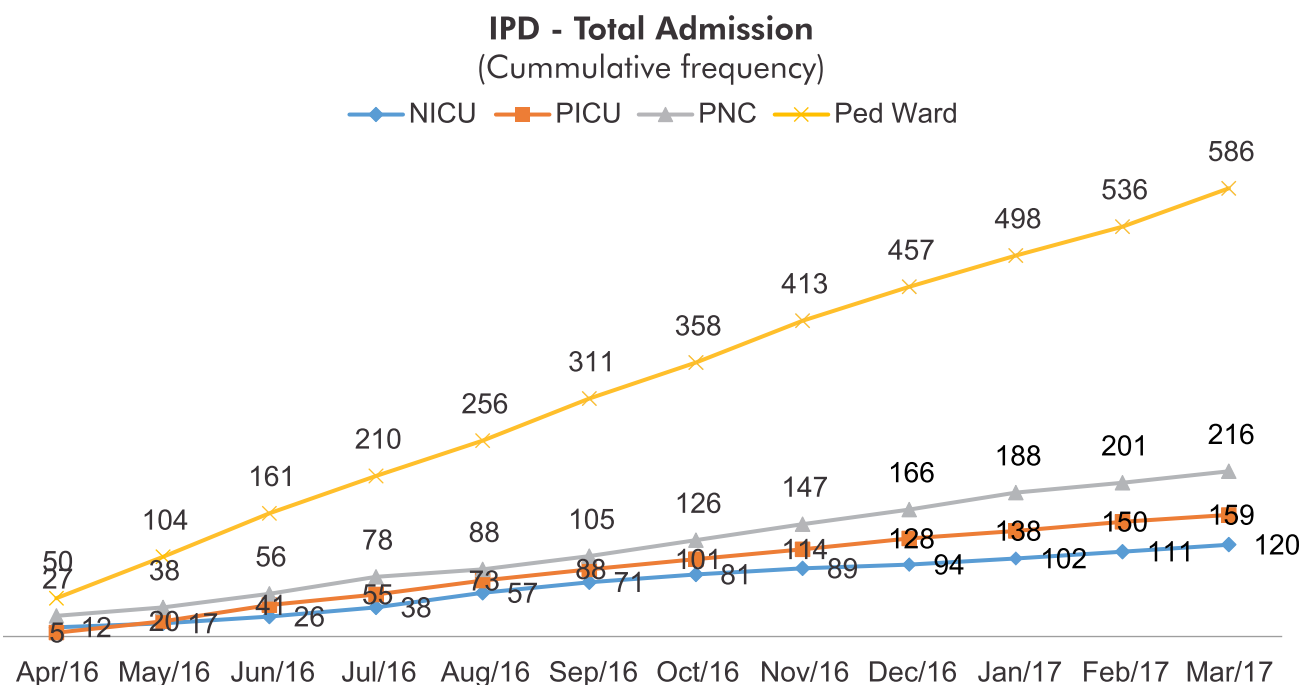
Pediatric Intensive Care Unit: The year 2016-17 saw the number of PICU admissions 159. The 6 bedded unit is equipped with non invasive and invasive monitoring, non invasive and invasive mechanical ventilation services along with

capabilities for services like peritoneal dialysis, central line placements, thoracostomy, emergency ventricular taps amongst others.

Neonatal Services: With the regularisation obstetrics services, neonatal services got a fillip. The department provided postnatal care to 80 neonates in year 2015-16 to 216 in 2016-17. Strengthening of neonatal services is evolving into Level III NICU capable of providing comprehensive neonatal intensive care. A total admission increased from 50 in 2015-16 to 120 in 2016-17.

Pediatric Emergency Desk: The department in anticipation of start of emergency services at the institute started the Pediatric Emergency services in 2015-16 to provide services to intramural follow-up beyond OPD hours. It is continued by the department as a pilot project before formal opening of emergency services.

10.19 DEPARTMENT OF PAEDIATRIC SURGERY

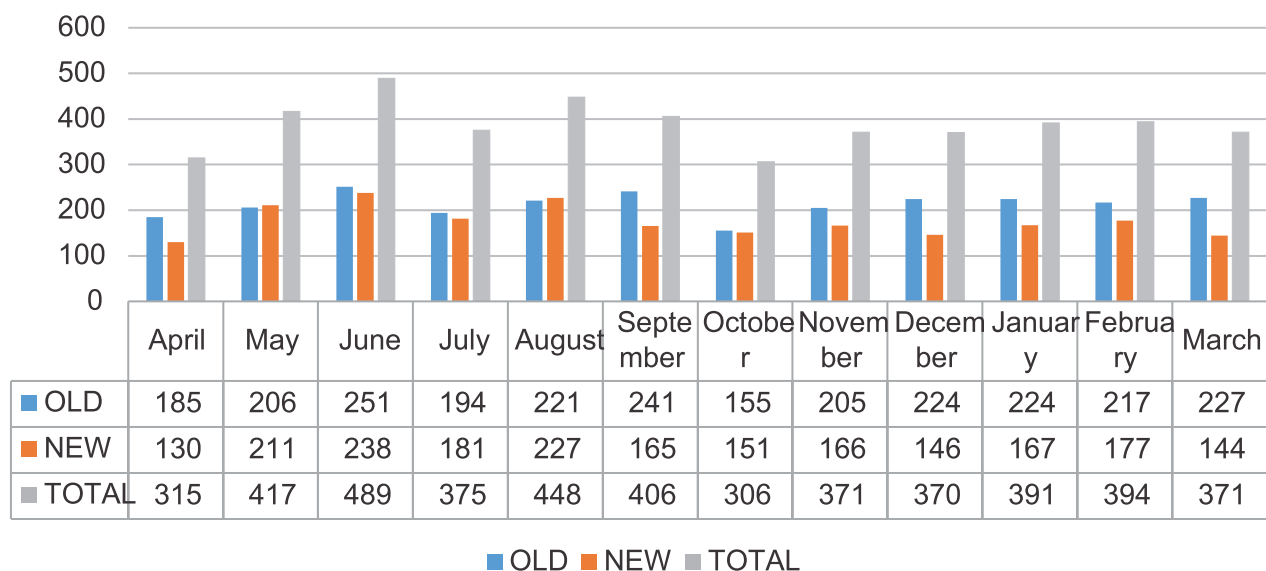

The department is now providing antenatal advice to expectant mothers where baby in the womb has some developmental aberrations. The department has started minimal invasive surgery in paediatric surgery and many cases of Laparoscopic surgeries, Thoracoscopic surgeries are performed in the department. Endoscopic procedures like Bronchoscopy, Oesophagoscopy and Urethrocystoscopy has been started in the department.

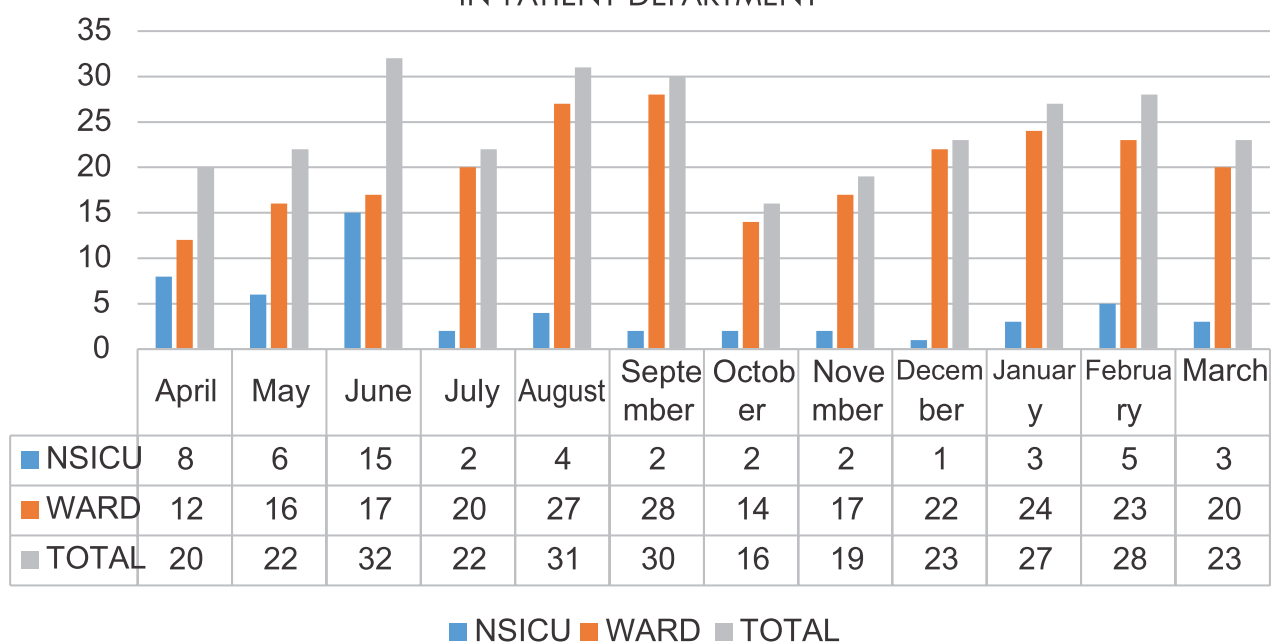

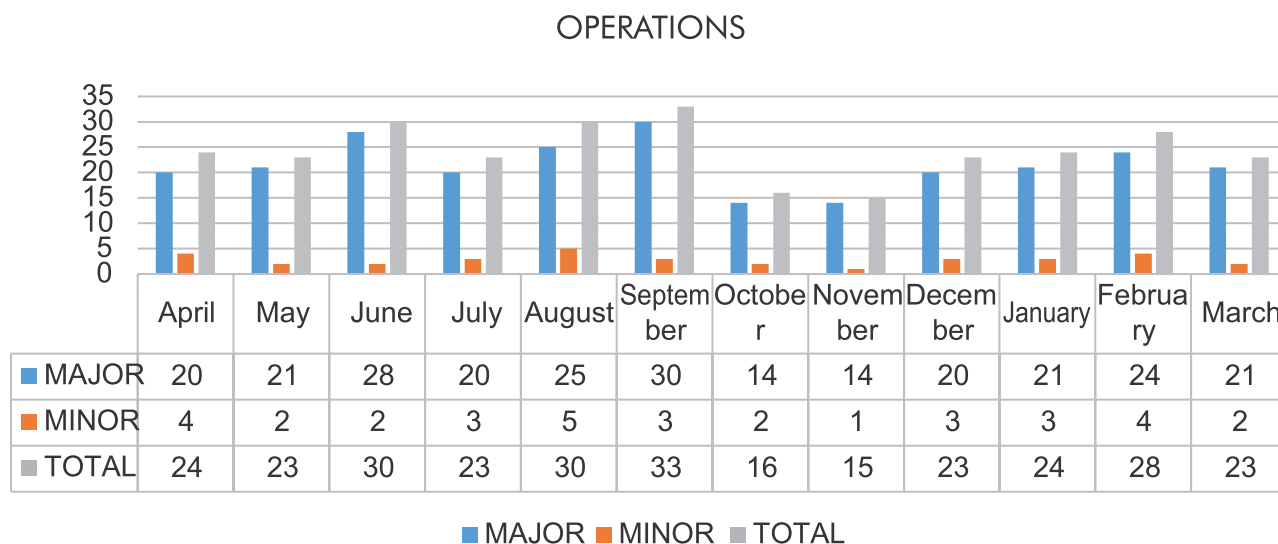

10.20 DEPARTMENT OF PATHOLOGY & LABORATORY MEDICINE

Besides routine histopathological, routine and special hematology and cytological investigations department initiated immunohistochemistry services for diagnosis.

The major achievement has been to set up fluorescence in situ hybridization (FISH), Genotyping/ SNP analysis and running government funded projects for clinical genetic. The department is putting sincere efforts to upgrade Cytogenetics and Molecular Genetic Laboratory to upgrade as Centre of Excellence in Genetic Disorders for better management, training and research in the field of Clinical Genetics which is not existing in Bihar. Department is also putting efforts to initiate "Certificate" course work (4-12 weeks) on Human Genetics and Biotechnology.

Patient care laboratory services has started providing the following facilities :

- Histopathology: 1941 cases,
- Immunohistochemistry: 101 Cases.
- Cytopathology including PAP smear, Fluid

cytology & Ultrasound guided, CT guided FNAC and biopsy (in children also with facility of Anaesthesia)- 3937 cases

- Special Haematology: PBS – 896 smears
BMA and Biopsy – 60 cases
- Routine stain established: H & E, Papani - colaou, and Giemsa.
- Establishment of special stains with preparation of SOP: AFB (TB & Lepa), PAS, PAS with Diastase, Alcian Blue, Reticulin, Perl's stain, Giemsa stain (May-Grunwald and Jenner Giemsa)
- Cytochemistry: Established and started – MPO, PAS
- IHC related with breast carcinoma is established.
- Renal, Endoscopic, Bronchoscopic, Liver and Muscle biopsy procedure and reporting is also established.

10.23 DEPARTMENT OF PHYSIOLOGY

The department of Physiology is established to undertake undergraduate, post graduate and doctoral teaching and training. Working on its mission to establish it as a part of centre of excellence, the department has established neurophysiology and respiratory physiology and is in process of establishing cardiac and reproductive physiology labs. With the existing facilities, the department is providing EEG, ECG, Lung function test and HRV services to the clinical departments regularly besides the routine undergraduate teaching. On an average 3-4 EEG per day are being recorded and reported by the department.

The departments of Physiology, Anatomy and Biochemistry consented and implemented

mutually for partial integration of the teaching learning content with partial adoption of AIIMS Delhi module of teaching on experimental basis with fair success.

Students are also encouraged to participate in research through short term research programme. One research project has been proposed for the Short term studentship program to ICMR from the department. The final report of last year's STS project had been submitted this year successfully.

10.24 DEPARTMENT OF PLASTIC SURGERY

The department of plastic surgery is one of the superspeciality departments which is well established and provides excellent patient care services. The department is managing a variety of cases viz. burn wounds & post burn deformities, hand surgery (congenital & traumatic), brachial plexus injuries, few craniofacial deformities, maxillofacial cases, cleft lip & palate, various flaps for traumatic wounds, bed sores, oncoplastic reconstructions, vascular malformations, genital anomalies & aesthetic surgeries. Other than patient care, the department is actively involved in academic activities like undergraduate and nursing teaching which includes lecture classes, clinical postings and departmental teaching for the residents.

10.25 DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHIATRY

The department of Psychiatry, AIIMS Patna has an active consultation liaison psychiatry services to regularly attend calls and psychiatric emergencies that emerge in other

department of AIIMS Patna.

The department is also involved in imparting training of professionals and non-professionals in the field of mental health (awareness to

research level), services to both community oriented and community centred services and developing health education materials for both professionals and non-professionals in the field of mental health.

Currently primary aim of the department is to develop highly trained manpower, starting indoor services, child guidance clinic, drug dependence treatment centre and other

sophisticated and advanced psychiatric treatment procedures like rTMS, bio-feedback therapies, and various other psycho-behavioural therapeutic modalities.

The department also imparts teaching of psychology and psychiatry courses to B.Sc Nursing students that includes clinical as well as theory classes.

10.26 DEPARTMENT OF PULMONARY MEDICINE & TUBERCULOSIS

The department of Pulmonary Medicine caters to a wide spectrum of diseases of the chest ranging from airway disorders like chronic bronchitis and bronchial asthma, infections like pneumonias and tuberculosis, pleural disorders, carcinomas of the respiratory tract, occupation-related lung disorders, to interstitial lung diseases. The department is committed to deliver quality clinical services to all patients suffering from respiratory illness. The department started OPD service in August 2013. Since then the number of patients has regularly increased. From 1st April 2016 to 31st March 2017 we have treated 14,642 (11,020 in 2015-16) patients in OPD & 362 (119 in 2015-16) in IPD.

10.28 DEPARTMENT OF RADIOTHERAPY

The department has consolidated on various fronts in the year 2016-2017. Many new facets in cancer care like the tobacco cessation clinic have been added. The department is committed to provide world class patient centered care. It aims to deliver high quality oncology service in a compassionate and supportive manner. Evidence based oncology is the main focus of clinical practice. The department is motivated for early detection and prevention of cancer. Free cancer screening and awareness camps and rallies are being organised on a regular basis. Emphasis is to offer personalized medicine to the common man with affordable ease. The department cater to the needs of Paediatric oncology with an MOU with CANKIDS a charitable national society. The department strive hard to foster leadership development in the field of oncology through training programmes. The department actively contribute in Quick Medical Response Training (QMRT) for nuclear disaster management and Anti-Tobacco campaigns.

Special clinics run through the department

include:

- Head & Neck Oncology Clinic.
- Paediatric Oncology Clinic
- Breast Clinic.
- CML and GIST clinic: Patients are enrolled into the GIPAP programme through which they are offered tab Imatinib free or at a reduced rate depending on financial status.
- Pain and Palliation Clinic: Patients are assessed jointly with the Anaesthesia Department and drugs prescribed. Morphine has been made available to the patients.
- Tobacco Cessation Clinic: In collaboration with CFM and Pulmonary Departments.
- Day Care Chemotherapy Services: Dedicated specialized nurse carry out chemotherapy under the doctor's guidance. The chemotherapy protocols followed are in accordance to the international standard guidelines Ever since chemotherapy was started in April 2014, approximately 2500 chemotherapy infusions have been done including infusion of the Targeted agents like Rituximab. With the availability of space

chemotherapy Day Care Unit has been planned.

There is a dedicated two inpatient beds for cancer patients.

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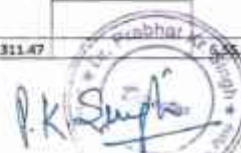

This is the fifth annual account of the Institute since coming into existence in 2009 and period of account is consolidated for the period from 1st of April, 2016 to 31st of March, 2017.

1. The Financial Statement of Institute Accounts

The Financial Statement is prepared in three parts viz. Receipt and Payments account, Income and Expenditure Account and Balance sheet. The Annual Account is prepared on Uniform Format of accounts for Central Autonomous Bodies as applicable for AIIMS, Patna also.

2. Accounting Policies

The standard Accounting Policies has been adopted in preparation of Annual Account of Institute which are stated below:

(i) Account Convention

The accounts have been prepared on historical cost basis, unless otherwise stated and on accrual method of accounting.

(ii) Revenue Recognition

The Institute is funded by the Grant from MOH & FW. In addition, Institute requirement of infrastructures like Furniture and Fixtures, and Equipments made over to Institute have been recognised as Grant in Kind. The Institute has also generated internal resources through admission fee, examination fee, sale of tender documents etc.

(iii) Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties, taxes and other incidental and direct expenses incurred in connection with the acquisition of assets. Fixed Assets are capitalised with the value of its acquisition

4. Provisions

All Income and Expenditure are maintained on accrual basis. Provisions has been calculated of all known liabilities having amount is known at the date of balance sheet.

5. Accounting Policy adopted for government grant

Grant-in-aid is received from Ministry of Health and Family Welfare Govt. of India (PMSSY.Scheme).

Grant/Subsidies includes Grant-in-aid (General head), Grant-in-aid (Salary head) and Grant-in-aid (Creation of Capital Assets).

Grants from the Central Government are accounted for on realization basis for the financial year 2016-17

Unspent Grants have been transferred to Reserves & Surplus Account and shown as unspent grant at the end of financial year 2016-17.

Grants related to depreciable fixed assets has been treated as deferred income which is recognized in the income and expenditure statement on a systematic and rotational basis over the useful life of the assets i.e. such grant is recognized to income over the periods and in the proportion in which depreciation on those assets is charged. The deferred income balance is separately disclosed in account in schedule 2 under the head capital reserve attached with balance sheet.

Grants related to revenue is recognized in the income and expenditure statement in schedule 13 attached with balance sheet.

6. Foreign Currency Transaction

Transaction denominated in foreign currency are accounted at the exchange rate prevailing at the date of transaction.

We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Patna as at 31 March 2017 the Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Powers & Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 18 (2) of the AIIMS (Amendment) Act, 2012. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (C&AG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc, if any are reported through Inspection Reports/C.A.Gs Audit Reports separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

iii. In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the AIIMS Patna as required under AIIMS Act, 1956 and AIIMS (Amendment) Act, 2012 as it appears from our examination of such books.

IV. We further report that:-

A. Balance Sheet

Fixed Assets (Schedule -8) ₹554.35 crore

A.1 Overstatement of Fixed Assets by ₹18.37 lakh.

The Institute exhibited ₹18.37 lakh for the equipment 'NCV/EMG/EP System' under the Fixed Assets Accounts (Schedule -8), which was received in the Institute during the year 2017-18 but this was taken into Accounts for the year 2016-17. Capitalization of this equipments in schedule 8 resulted in overstatement of Fixed Assets by ₹18.37 lakh

In reply the management stated that the Institute is capitalizing its Assets on the date of respective invoice of Assets. The reply is not acceptable as capitalization of the Assets should be after receiving the same.

B. Income & Expenditure Accounts

B.1 Depreciation (Schedule-8) ₹ 14.44 crore

B.1.1 As per Accounting Principles, depreciation on the Assets should be provided on Assets from their respective date of put to use (date of installation).

During scrutiny of Fixed Assets Accounts (Schedule-8) and related records for the year 2016-17, it was noticed that depreciation on the Assets was not provided as per above said Accounting Principles.

In violation of the above Accounting Policy, the Institute provided depreciation on 17 equipment amounting to ₹51.66 lakh which has not been installed during 2016-17.

This resulted in overstatement of depreciation by ₹51.66 and understatement of Fixed Assets by the same amount as annexed (A).

In reply the management stated that all 17 equipments are under trial run period. Reply is not acceptable as depreciation on Assets should be provided from their respective date of put to use.

B.2 Interest earned (Schedule 17) ₹15.76 crore

B.2.1 The Institute exhibited Saving Bank interest amounting to ₹14.04 lakh in the Schedule 17 which was earned prior to the year 2016-17. This has resulted in overstatement of interest earned and overstatement of income over expenditure by ₹ 14,04 lakh.

In reply the management stated that interest on Saving Bank account is recorded in books of accounts as and when it is credited into Bank account by the Bank. The reply is not

acceptable as the interest on Saving Bank account was not pertaining for the year 2016-17 and it should be exhibited as prior period income.

C Grants-in-Aid

The Institute received Grants-in-aid ₹140.00 crore from the ministry of Health & Family Welfare Department during the year. The unspent balance of previous year was amounting to ₹163.21 crore. The total funds available with the Institute was ₹303.21 crore, out of which the Institute utilized ₹144.14 crore during the year leaving a balance of ₹159.07 crore (excluding other income & project fund) as unutilized grants as on 31.03.2017.

(E). Management letter:

Deficiencies which have not been included in the Audit Report have been brought to the notice of the Director through a Management letter issued separately for remedial /corrective action.

v. Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure &Account/Receipt & Payment Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

vi. 

B. Income & Expenditure Accounts

B.1 Depreciation (Schedule-8) Rs.14.44 Crore

B.1.1- In this Para CAG team has raised question regarding charging depreciation on 17 assets which are still not put to use on balance sheet date i.e. as on 31.03.2017. In this regard we have to say that all 17 assets about which auditor is talking about has been installed prior to balance sheet date but they are under trial run period. In this regard discussion has also been made with previous year CAG team that assets which are under trial run period date of put to use will be date of installation of those assets rather than date of FAC. So institute is consistently following accounting policy related to charging of depreciation.


